

Disability Parking

Transport Operations (Road Use Management—Road Rules) Regulation 2009

FACT SHEET

Across the Fraser Coast Region, Council is responsible for the regulation of parking in accordance with the Transport and Operations Road Use Management Act and Local Law No 5 (Parking) 2011.

Stopping in a Disability Parking Bay

A driver must not stop in a parking area for people with disabilities unless the driver's vehicle displays a current parking permit for people with disabilities and the driver complies with the conditions of use of the permit.

Disability Permits & Time Limited Parking

You can use your Australian permit to park for free at any on-street parking in local government metered and regulated parking areas for:

- Up to 30 minutes – when the limit shown on the sign is 30 minutes or less, and
- For an unlimited time when the time limits shown on the sign is 30 minutes or more.



Where should I park my vehicle?

Motorists should seek to find car parking on the road or in off-street car parks.

What if I park my vehicle there?

Council Parking Officers continue to conduct regular patrols across the region to ensure the safety of cyclists, motorists, and pedestrians.

Parking in a Disability Bay will result in an infringement being issued in accordance with the council's Local Laws.

On-the-spot fines may be issued.

How can I report unlawful parking?

If you are concerned about a vehicle parked unlawfully, please contact Fraser Coast Regional Council and a representative will investigate the matter.
